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24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 9, is amended to add an

28 <u>8-9-701. Title.</u>	
29 <u>This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Reusable</u>	
30 <u>Shopping Bag Act".</u>	
32 <u>8-9-702. Findings and legislative intent.</u>	
33 (a) The General Assembly finds that: 24 (1) The purchibition improved by this subchapter is necessary for	
 34 (1) The prohibition imposed by this subchapter is necessary for 35 the environmental, public health, and societal burdens created by single-use

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1	(2) Despite recycling and other voluntary solutions to control
2	pollution from plastic bags in Arkansas, only a small percentage of single-
3	use carryout bags are recycled, and the rest either take up valuable landfill
4	space or are discarded into the environment; and
5	(3) Reusable bags are an environmentally sound alternative to
6	single-use carryout bags.
7	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to encourage the
8	widespread use of reusable bags as an environmentally sound alternative to
9	single-use carryout bags.

11	8-9-703. Definitions.
12	As used in this subchapter:
13	(1) "Reusable bag" means a bag that is:
14	(A) Designed and manufactured for at least one hundred
15	<u>(100)</u> uses; and
16	(B) Made of washable material that does not contain lead
17	or any other heavy metal in a toxic amount, as determined by the Arkansas
18	Department of Environmental Quality;
19	(2)(A) "Single-use carryout bag" means a bag that is:
20	(i) Designed for one (1) or more uses, but fewer
21	than one hundred (100) uses;
22	(ii) Made of plastic; and
23	(iii) Provided by a store to a customer at a point
24	<u>of sale.</u>
25	(B) "Single-use carryout bag" does not include a bag made
26	of paper;
27	(3) "Store" means a retail establishment that provides single-
28	use carryout bags to its customers as a result of the sale of a product and
29	that meets any of the following requirements:
30	(A) Is a supermarket;
31	(B) Has over ten thousand square feet (10,000 sq. ft.) of
32	contiguous retail space that generates sales or use tax payable to the state
33	and has a licensed pharmacy on site; or
34	(C) Is a convenience food store or food mart engaged in
35	retailing a limited line of goods that generally includes milk, bread, soda,
36	and snacks; and

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1	(4) "Supermarket" means a full-line, self-service retail store
2	location that has gross annual sales of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) or
3	more and sells a line of dry grocery, canned goods, or nonfood items and some
4	perishable items.
5	
6	<u>8-9-704. Single-use carryout bag — Prohibition.</u>
7	<u>A store shall:</u>
8	(1) Not provide a single-use carryout bag to a customer; and
9	(2) Make reusable bags available for purchase by a customer.
10	
11	8-9-705. Administration and report.
12	(a) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall administer
13	this subchapter and may adopt rules it deems necessary to implement this
14	subchapter.
15	(b)(1) Annually on or before January 1 the department shall submit a
16	report to the Legislative Council regarding the effectiveness of this
17	subchapter in achieving widespread use of reusable bags and preserving
18	landfill space.
19	(2) The report shall include recommendations to:
20	(A) Further encourage the use of reusable bags by
21	consumers and retailers;
22	(B) Reduce the consumption of single-use carryout bags;
23	and
24	(C) Expand the definition of stores that are subject to
25	this subchapter to all other stores and retail establishments distributing
26	<u>single-use carryout bags.</u>
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28	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after January
