- Whereas the Town of Windham has a duty to protect the public health, safety, and welfare, which includes the community's environment and economy,
- Whereas single-use plastic shopping bags have been banned in cities and countries around the world as a result of their adverse environmental impacts,
- Whereas single-use plastic shopping bags have a noteworthy negative impact on the environment, including land and marine animals,
- Whereas single-use plastic shopping bags represent an unnecessary use of non-renewable resources,
- Whereas the plastic used in most single-use plastic shopping bags is not biodegradable,
- Whereas there is a lack of effective recycling programs for single-use plastic shopping bags,
- Whereas paper shopping bags containing less than forty percent (40%) post-consumer recycled content further deplete natural and non-renewable resources, and
- Whereas reusable shopping bags aid in reducing litter, protecting land and marine animals and habitat, protecting and conserving natural resources, and reducing the use of non-renewable resources,
- Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Town Council pursuant to Article 2, Section 3(I) of the Charter,
 - 1. To call upon all establishments engaged in retail sales located in Windham to cease the use of single-use plastic shopping bags and paper shopping bags with less than forty percent (40%) post-consumer content,

2. To encourage Windham residents to make use of recycled-content reusable shopping bags whenever and wherever possible, and

3. To seek support from the town's legislative delegation, other Maine cities and towns, and the Maine Municipal Association for a statewide ban on single-use plastic shopping bags and paper shopping bags with less than forty percent (40%) post-consumer recycled content, or to pass enabling legislation allowing municipalities to enact and enforce local ordinances imposing a charge for each single-use plastic shopping bag or paper shopping bag with less than forty percent (40%) post-consumer recycled content.
